

Andrea Sironi (Milan, 1964)

Andrea Sironi is Vice President and a Professor of Banking and Finance at Bocconi University in Milan, where he was Rector from 2012 to 2016. Previously, he was Vice Rector for international relations and Dean of the Graduate School. From 2014 to 2016, he was Chairman of CEMS – The Global Alliance in Management Education. Since January 2016, he has been Chairman of Borsa Italiana and, since October 2016, a Board Director of the London Stock Exchange Group.

Professor Sironi's research interests include risk management in financial institutions and international banking supervision and regulation. He has published and edited many books and articles in Italian and international refereed journals on these subjects.

He has held visiting positions at the Department of Finance of the Stern School of Business at New York University, the Research and Statistics Division of the Federal Reserve Board in Washington, and the Department of Economics of Sciences Po, Paris. In 2013, he was a member of the Group of experts for the valuation of the Bank of Italy's capital. From 2013 to 2016, he was a member of the strategic committee of FSI (*Fondo Strategico Italiano*). From 2018 to 2019, he was a Board Director of UniCredit Group.

From 1989 to 1990, he was a financial analyst at The Chase Manhattan Bank in London. Professor Sironi has also been an independent Board Director of major industrial and financial listed companies and a consultant of leading national and international financial institutions.

He currently sits on the boards of Istituto di Studi di Politica Internazionale (ISPI) and EASL International Liver Foundation (Geneva), and is a member of the International Advisory Council of Stockholm School of Economics, the Advisory Board of Nova School of Business and Economics (Lisbon), the Advisory Board of Cometa, a non-profit organisation, and the Board of Directors of Fondazione Italia Sociale.
