

Maria Alessandra Stefanelli (Bologna, 1964)

She graduated in Economics from the University of Bologna and in Law from the University of Camerino and began her academic career at the University of Bologna, becoming a research fellow in 1992 and an Associate Professor of Business Law in 1999. In 2006, she took up the post of Associate Professor of Business Law at the Department of Economics of the University of Bologna, where, in 2011, she became Full Professor of Business Law. In the academic field, she has held executive positions (including Head of Department) and she has been a member of Scientific Commissions and Committees (among others, she is currently Director of the Italian Centre for Advanced Studies for Small and Medium Enterprises, a member of the PhD Board in European Law of the University of Bologna, and a member of the Council of the Department of Sociology and Business Law of the University of Bologna).

At the University of Bologna, she currently teaches Credit Law and Financial Intermediaries Law. She participates in various research projects, is a speaker at research conferences and seminars, and is the author of numerous publications.

Her scientific work focuses on numerous research topics, including the analysis of functions and instruments issued by public regulators and supervisors for the banking and financial market, the study of the public regulation of business and industrial activity and of the economic and social effects on the market and the production environment.

She is a founding member of the A.D.D.E. (the National Association of Lecturers in Business Law).
