INTESA SANPAOLO, FONDAZIONE CON IL SUD AND FONDAZIONE SAN GENNARO PRESENT THE "LUCE" PROJECT FOR NAPLES' RIONE SANITÀ

Training, employment and inclusion of young people through art in Naples

Naples, 20 May 2021 – Today, Intesa Sanpaolo, Fondazione CON IL SUD and Fondazione di Comunità San Gennaro presented the LUCE project, a training and social inclusion initiative for the young inhabitants of Naples' Rione Sanità district through art, which is also beneficial in terms of job opportunities for young people and enhancement of the district's historical and artistic heritage.

The initiative involves artistic workshops for 60 young people aged between 16 and 25, in the **Chiesa di Santa Maria Maddalena**, located in the heart of the "Cristallini" area, with theory and practical workshops led by artists and experts in fields including painting, cinematography, photography and local knowledge. During one of the training courses, the young people involved will fresco the church and the district's most hidden alleys together with internationally renowned muralists.


Two new infopoints will also be opened at the **Chiesa di Sant'Aspreno ai Crociferi**, which will be available seven days a week, giving visitors the opportunity to access the workshop of contemporary artist Jago, and at the **Basilica of San Severo fuori le Mura**, a church that since December 2020 hosts the work "*Il Figlio Velato*", as well as the Catacombs of San Severo. Both initiatives will provide employment for a number of young people in the neighbourhood.

The LUCE project, supported by Fondazione CON IL SUD, Fondazione di Comunità San Gennaro and Intesa Sanpaolo, addresses important structural assets of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP), including: the fight against inequality, employment of young people in vulnerable situations, urban regeneration in marginalised contexts, and promotion of the third sector's contribution to society and development in Southern Italy. The initiative is also in line with what the Fondazione di Comunità San Gennaro and the Cooperativa La Paranza have been doing for years in the Rione Sanità, through important training projects involving the recovery and enhancement of local resources, such as the public opening of the Catacombs of San Gennaro.

"The Fondazione CON IL SUD has been investing for over 10 years in the Rione Sanità, not only in terms of economic resources, but above all by establishing a relationship of cooperation and trust with the local community", commented Carlo Borgomeo, president of Fondazione CON IL SUD. "We have invested and continue to invest with conviction in human capital, the







true wealth of every area. We are therefore delighted to renew our commitment and to contribute once again to the development of a neighbourhood that has so much to offer".

"The initiative is jointly planned by the Fondazione CON IL SUD, the Fondazione di Comunità San Gennaro and Intesa Sanpaolo, which is providing not only financial support, but also the Group's specialist social and cultural expertise. The project has a twofold goal: to reclaim abandoned artistic heritage in the Rione Sanità, a very problematic area of Naples, and to train local youth so that they can find new employment opportunities in the art and tourism sectors. In doing so, Intesa Sanpaolo once again affirms its commitment in terms of social and cultural responsibility undertaken in the 2018-2021 Business Plan, carrying out a systemic action together with institutions, third-sector organisations and civil society – represented by artists who generously pass on their knowledge through training workshops – to promote the sustainable and inclusive growth of the areas in which it operates", commented Elena Jacobs, Head of Social Initiatives and University Relations at Intesa Sanpaolo



The Fondazione CON II SUD is a private non-profit organisation created from an association between banking foundations and the third sector and voluntary sector to foster development in Southern Italy by promoting social cohesion.
